

## CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES OF JANUARY 4, 2022

The Enterprise City Council convened in Regular Session at 6:00 p.m., Tuesday, January 4, 2022, in the Council Chambers at City Hall.

STAFF REPORTS

Chief Michael Moore reported from December 30, 2021, to January 2, 2022, the Police Department answered a total of 876 calls, 117 of which were firework-related, which resulted in the issuance of 22 city ordinance citations. The city’s enhanced enforcement stemmed from numerous complaints about the noise, the trash left behind, and the threat of property damage and will continue as long as the firework ordinance is in effect.

REVIEW & CONSIDER ORDINANCE 12-21-21 (Sale of Property/Goolsby)

The President Pro-Tem called for consideration of Ordinance 12-21-21 providing for the sale of .517 acres of property located on the north side of East Lee Street and south side of Gibson Street to Eugene and Charlene Goolsby at a cost of \$11,300.00. Council Members thanked city staff, meeting attendees, and wished everyone a Happy New Year.


Following Council remarks, President Pro-Tem Rich led the audience in a rendition of “Happy Birthday” in recognition of Mayor Cooper’s birthday.
